## What's new in research?

#### Latest publications

During the first quarter of 2025, we published 7 new papers written by Rodrigo Tenorio, David Keitel, Neha Singh, Anna Heffernan, Tomeu Garau, Joan Duran, Catalina Sbert and Sayantani Bera.

#### **Outsanding members**

These past months, our members have been granted with numerous awards and positions. Maria Antònia Ferrer was awarded a PREDOC International fellowship to persue her PhD under the supervision of our Dr. David Keitel and Dr. Brynmor Haskell, from the Università degli Studi di Milano Statale. Since this past February, Joan Duran has beein appointed Deputy Director of the Àrea d'Investigació. This role includes supporting UIB's research policy, promoting funding acquisition, and fostering collaboration between university research groups and external institutions.

#### **Research projects**

The Tecnologías avanzadas para la exploración del universo  $\gamma$  sus componentes project from the GRAVITY group has been extended until the end of 2025. Moreover, they recieved two new projects of 65.000,00€ each.

#### A whole lot of gravitational waves

On December 21, 2024, Rafel Jaume and Joan-René Mérou, PhD students of the IAC3, returned from a threemonth research stay at the Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory (LIGO) in Livingston, USA. Their work focused on improving the detector's





sensitivity, identifying and mitigating noise sources, and contributing to real-time follow-ups of gravitational-wave candidate events during the fourth observing run (O4). Their work received a lot of attention from the media, such as <u>IB3</u> or <u>Diario de Mallorca</u>, curiously enough, on the same day that Joan Llobera (with a team of 6 people) was on duty when a very rare detection of at least one neutron star (an object that remains largely unexplored) happened.



### Women in science, and more!

To celebrate the International Day of Women and Girls in Science, Ana Belén Petro and María Jesús Álvarez (who studied together at UIB) took part in IB3 Ràdio's Téntol, a programme about Balearic language and culture. They spoke about their research in digital image restoration and dynamical systems, their experience teaching mathematics at university, and the persistent gender gap in STEM. They highlighted the low number of women in leadership roles and the importance of female role models in science. The episode ended with a fun quiz on science-themed sayings.

Moreover, that same week we published several reels on social media interviewing the IAC3 women, from PhDs to full professors, where they explained their research, their journey as female researchers and the importance of the Day of Women and Girls in Science. Later, on March 8th, to mark International Women's Day, the Equality and Diversity Committee at IAC3 approved a <u>new commitment</u> to fostering equality at all levels and to standing against discrimination of any kind, whether based on gender, age, ethnicity, nationality, religion, or sexual orientation, to promote inclusive research practices within the institute
